October 1, 2023 is the 1<sup>st</sup> day students can complete the 2023-24 FAFSA.

Students will use family's 2022 tax returns.

#### **FSAID**

Student and guardian will each need to get a FSAID at fsaid.ed.gov

After October 1<sup>st</sup>- Students can apply for the AR Challenge "Lottery" Scholarship at scholarship.adhe.edu

#### SELECTIVE SERVICES

Registration is required for all males 18 and over.

#### **UPCOMING EVENTS & DATES:**

Attention Senior Student Athletes: Applications are now available for a \$1000 AAA/Centennial Bank Scholarship which will be awarded to 5 girls and 5 boys. Students must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 and a 21 ACT score. Applications are available on Mrs. Rachuy's board and are due by April 1st.

Mandy Coats Memorial Scholarship Applications are available on Mrs. Rachuy's board. Students must have a minimum 2.0 GPA, be an active member of a church and/or other Christian organization, and plan to attend an accredited college or university on a full-time basis. Applications may be submitted between January 1st and April 1st.

The American College Foundation Visionary Scholarship Program is accepting applications for the 2024-2025 school year. Seniors should see Mrs. Rachuy's board for more information.

Applications for the John and Lee Ella McDonald Scholarship are available on Mrs. Rachuy's board. This is a scholarship specifically for Charleston students, so I encourage ALL Seniors to apply. Applications must be turned in to the office by March 27th, or you can send it on your own as long as it is postmarked by March 29th.

The American College Foundation Visionary Scholarship Program is accepting applications for the 2024-2025 school year. Seniors should see Mrs. Rachuy's board for more information.

Applications for the Francis Carol Criss Ramsey Scholarship are now available. This scholarship is for females that plan on pursuing a career in teaching. This is a \$500 scholarship. Applications are due by April 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Seniors Continued:**

Seniors who are interested in attending ASU-Newport and becoming a high voltage line worker should email Mrs. Rachuy for a link to the High Voltage Lineman Scholarship. The recipient will receive a scholarship covering tuition and books for the High Voltage Lineman Program at Arkansas State University (ASU) Newport, valued at over \$8,000. Applications are due by March 31st.

Senior student-athletes with a 3.0 GPA and a 21 should apply for the AAA/Centennial Bank Scholarship. Applications are available on Mrs. Rachuy's board and are due April 1st.

Greg Williams from the Fort Smith Fire Department will be here to talk to interested Seniors during advisory on March 8th. Interested Seniors should sign up in the office by Wednesday, March 6th.

The Arkansas Association of Pupil Transportation will be awarding one \$2,000 scholarship to a graduating senior who has a relative who has worked as a school bus driver. You may pick up application from Mrs. Rachuy's board. They are due to Mrs. Rachuy, by Tuesday, March 12th.

Seniors who have at least a 2.5 GPA and plan to pursue a teaching career should email Mrs. Rachuy for a link to apply for the \$1,000 Future Educators Excellence Scholarship. The application deadline is July 5th.

Seniors who are residents of Franklin County and have an agricultural background OR are pursuing a career in the agricultural or family consumer science field should apply for a \$500 Franklin County Farm Bureau Scholarship. Students should be in the top third of their graduating class and should demonstrate outstanding achievement and good citizenship. To apply, students should submit an essay style resume outlining his or her qualifications. Students should also include a copy of their high school transcript and their ACT scores. These may be dropped off at the Charleston or Ozark Farm Bureau office by March 29th or to Mrs. Rachuy by March 28th.

Please do not complete the FAFSA at this time. There are changes being made to the forms. Mrs. Rachuy will notify Seniors when it is available to complete.
