**July 12<sup>th</sup> – Deadline is June 6<sup>th</sup> – Late registration is June 20<sup>th</sup> (This test is not given at Charleston)**

Students interested in applying for the ACF Visionary Scholarship can pick up a flyer from Mrs. Rachuy's board. Applications are due June 1, 2025.

If you have a 3.0 GPA and will be enrolled full-time in a college or university this fall, then you should apply for a \$1000 Kuru Footwear Scholarship. You can find the application and more information about the scholarship at <https://www.kurufootwear.com/pages/scholarship> The deadline to apply is July 4th.

Seniors with a 2.75 cumulative GPA at the end of the first semester of their senior year can apply for a \$500 Chamber Scholarship. Applications are available on Mrs. Rachuy's board and must be turned in to the office by April 30th at 3:00 pm.

In honor of Carl and Rosemary Underwood, the Charleston PTO has established two \$250 scholarships. The scholarships will be awarded to one male and one female senior student.
