




### 2024 ATLAS CHARLESTON SCHOOL DISTRICT SCORES


Percentage of Students that were Proficient

# FEDERAL REPORT OF FUNDS 2024-2025

- ♦ Title I Title I FTE Reading Specialist, .20 FTE Federal Coordinator, 1.5 FTE Paraprofessionals, and 1 FTE Intervention Specialist, Professional Development for staff, Elementary tutoring program, materials and supplies for classrooms, computer software programs for math and reading, Chromebooks, 5th grade orientation, welfare students, Grandparents Day, .2857 FTE Program Supervisor for Maggie House, and materials and supplies for Maggie House
- ♦ Title IIA and Title IV funds will be transferred to Title I



# SPECIAL NEEDS FUNDING 2024-2025

- ♦ ESA funds are used to pay for salaries of: 2.0 FTE Paraprofessionals, 0.5 FTE Counselor, 0.65 FTE Curriculum Specialist. It is also used to purchase Chromebooks, Classroom Library books, materials for literacy, math and stem instruction, online software for math and literacy, ACT prep, tutoring, credit recovery, and parent involvement activities and materials.
- Professional Development funds are used to send staff to workshops and conferences for the purpose of increasing teacher quality in instructional areas. Some of the funds are transferred to ESA.
- ♦ ALE funds are used for the Charleston ALE Program.
