

Inclement Weather Policies for Charleston Schools

The Charleston School District was approved, by the Arkansas department of Education, for 5 AMI (Alternate Methods of Instruction) make up days, should the district miss school days due to unforeseen circumstances.

Our current calendar has the first 2 days that are missed to be made up on January 20, 2020 and May 22, 2020. Should we miss more than those 2 days and or days after January 20, the Superintendent will declare an AMI day.

What is an AMI Day?

AMI days are intended to extend learning days should students have to miss a day of school. The Charleston School District has been approved for 5 days.

How does it work?

Should the Charleston School District have to be closed during a normal school day and we have used our 2 original days for makeup, the Superintendent will declare an AMI day. This information will be posted on the district website, social media and an automated phone call.

What is expected of my student during an AMI day?

Students will receive classroom assignments from their teacher, by the way of packets, google classroom or email, depending on age appropriateness. Students will have 5 days to complete those assignments after the AMI Day has been declared and students have returned to school. Attendance will be taken.
